Whitley Bay FC Travel Plan

The FA Carlsberg Vase Final – 10th May 2009

The following information has been put together by Wembley Stadium to assist Whitley Bay FC fans in planning their journey to and from the Stadium for the FA Carlsberg Vase Final 2009.

This information is correct at the time of compilation. Visitors are encouraged to check with the appropriate transport providers closer to the date of the event for any updates.

By Rail

The Stadium is serviced by 3 stations and 5 rail lines, including:

Wembley Park Station – Jubilee and Metropolitan Underground Lines. On exiting the Station, follow the pedestrian route under Empire way and up Olympic Way to the front of the Stadium. Allow for a 10 minute walk. **Please note there will be no Jubilee line service between London Bridge and Stanmore for this event due to engineering works.**

Wembley Stadium Station – Chiltern Railways line for services from the Midlands, Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire and London to Wembley Stadium. The station is located on the south side of the Stadium. Please allow for a 5 minute walk.

Wembley Central Station – Bakerloo Underground Line and London Overground Line. On exiting the station, turn right and walk in an easterly direction along the High Road, past McDonalds and Burger King, to the Wembley Triangle junction and Clock Tower Island. Turn left into Wembley Hill Road, cross the road and follow the pedestrian route across the White Horse Bridge. Allow for a 15 minute walk.

To avoid ticket office queues when leaving the stadium, we recommend you buy your Tube ticket as part of your National Rail ticket. Alternatively, buy an Oyster card online in advance. Using an Oyster card is the quickest and cheapest way to travel when using the London Underground or selected National Rail services including Chiltern Railways. Wembley Park and Wembley Central Stations are in Zone 4. Visit www.tfl.gov.uk/oyster for more information.

Remember to plan your journey in advance; checking for engineering works or service disruptions which may impact your journey and always confirm what time the last services operate to make sure you can get home.



Rail Travel from Whitley to Wembley Stadium

The timetable for trains from Whitley Bay (Metro) Station and Newcastle to London King’s Cross is shown as follows:

Fans should then travel from King’s Cross St Pancras Underground Station to Wembley Park Underground Station using the Metropolitan Line (allow 45 minutes to reach Wembley Stadium from London King’s Cross).

Rail Travel from Wembley Stadium to Whitley

Visitors returning to Whitley Bay are advised to travel from Wembley Park Underground Station on the Metropolitan Line to King’s Cross St Pancras then to travel on National Rail from there. Allow 60 minutes to travel from Wembley Stadium to London King’s Cross.

Park and Ride



Visitors travelling by car to the Stadium can utilise Park and Ride options and make the last part of their journey by public transport. Some park and ride options to consider include:

- Park at a Chiltern Railways Station and travel by train into Wembley Stadium Station. These stations are suitable if travelling from the north.
 - Warwick Parkway - CV35 8RH
 - Banbury - OX16 5AB
 - Bicester North - OX26 6EF
 - High Wycombe - HP13 6NN

Car Parking



The local authority operates a protective parking zone on event days, extending in a 1.5 mile radius around the Stadium. Only residents with permits will be allowed to park within this zone and the local council has stated that illegally parked vehicles will be issued with large parking fines and/or towed away.

Parking is available in the Official Wembley Stadium car parks and can be pre-booked via www.csparking.com/stadium. Passes including directions to the car park will be posted out by the car park operator in the week leading up to the event. Parking for Blue Badge holders is available at a cost of £12 per a pass and will entitle holders to park in the blue badge area of one of the two onsite car parks, as indicated on the pass. Coach and Minibus parking is available in the Stadium Coach Park and will cost £40 for this event.

The stadium car parks do not open until **3 hours** prior to kick off, being 11:30am on the 10th May. Vehicles should not arrive prior to this time as they will not be able to access the site and will congest local roads. Vehicles must vacate the car parks by **1.5 hours** following the conclusion of the match.
